Most European pears require cross pollination with another variety. Seckel is considered self fruitful in warm climates, but may not be in the North. Varieties are listed in the above pollination chart in blooming sequence, for maximum fruit set pair pears that are close together on the chart. In locations subject to late spring frost, late bloomers such as Bosc, Comice, Moonglow and Orcas may be more fruitful.
